

## Service Levels Analysis - Randwick, Waverley and Woollahra Councils

### **Executive Summary**

A high level analysis of the service levels offered by Randwick, Waverley and Woollahra councils has been carried out, focusing on community services, waste services and roads, drainage and open space asset classes. The purpose of this analysis is to gain an understanding of where and why service levels differ and the potential cost implication of extending all services to all residents.

Service levels related to road reserves and community services adopted the Randwick service model in the SGS financial model detailed in their report 'Eastern Sydney Local Government Review'. Any additional services or higher service levels provided by Waverley or Woollahra councils in these areas would need to be costed for the group and included in the financial model to ensure no loss or degradation of services in any LGA.

The services offered by the three councils are very similar. Only two services were identified that would need to be included within the SGS financial model: Waverley's Meals on Wheels service and their council run childcare centres. The income associated with the grants and fees that fund these services have already been included in the model. This equates to an additional expense of **\$3.9m** per year (\$27m over 10 years under the 3 year transition period or \$35m under a 1 year transition period).

While each council's services are very similar, the frequency at which these services are carried out differed in many areas. Randwick's open space program had higher maintenance levels than Waverley, but less frequent inspection levels. While Randwick's inspection levels for road and drainage assets were more frequent, Waverley was carrying out more frequent scheduled maintenance on some of these assets. Both councils had very similar waste and cleaning schedules, with the major difference being Waverley's more frequent residential street sweeping.

Reasons for some of these service level differences included asset materials, age, utilisation, area density and environmental issues. No change to the SGS model is required as Waverley's road service levels could still be maintained by changing to Randwick's asset material type.

The overall impact on the SGS financial model under a 3 year transition period is an increase in costs of \$27m, resulting in an adjusted net surplus of \$418m under option 1 over ten years (before asset upliftment and debt repayment).

### SGS Economics and Planning Financial Model - cost drivers

The financial model calculated by SGS Economics and Planning in their report 'Eastern Sydney Local Government Review' divided services into two categories - those with costs driven by dwelling numbers and those that are not. Of relevance to this service level analysis, the categorisation of the service levels was as follows:

If Waverley or Woollahra provide a service or a higher service level than Randwick the cost of providing the service at that level will need to be costed for all 3 councils and included in the model. If Waverley or Woollahra provide a higher service level than Randwick this has already been provided for in the SGS model.

The cost of providing **open space and recreation, stormwater management** and **waste services** is driven by factors including existing open space, geography and commercial centres, hence the current costs and service levels for each council were applied in the model - i.e. it was assumed those service levels would be retained for the respective LGA.

Services driven by dwelling numbers adopted the Randwick service model. A closer review of these services has been undertaken to ensure no loss of service or service level reduction has occurred within the Waverley and Woollahra LGAs.

### Services Offered - Randwick, Waverley and Woollahra

The data supplied by each council reveals the services offered by each council are very similar.

### **Community Services**

Randwick, Woollahra and Waverley councils provide an extensive number of community services. While some of the programs may differ they largely support and engage the same target community members. A larger number of Waverley's services are run in house, while Randwick and Woollahra support and fund external providers for the same services.

Some of the services listed on the Community Services report were included in the SGS financial model at their present cost and service level. The services include libraries, community centres and halls and other cultural services.

Services relating to social protection, aged, disabled, children, youth and family services were costed based on the Randwick service model. These services need to be reviewed to ensure both Woollahra and Waverley continue to provide the same services within their LGA.

### Service Levels - Randwick and Waverley

Waverley and Randwick have supplied information regarding the frequency level for each service. There are several areas where these levels differ, however this may be due to factors such as the type of asset utilised to provide the service rather than the actual quality of the service.

The service levels have been compared and discussed with Randwick Council managers to determine if Randwick would need to increase its service level to meet Waverley's current service model.

### SGS Economics and Planning Financial Model - impact

The cost of ensuring Waverley's current service levels are not diminished has been deducted from the SGS financial models for both the 3 year and 1 year transition models. The results are tabled below:

### Conclusion

This high level analysis of the service levels offered by Randwick, Waverley and Woollahra councils has revealed that while mostly the same services are carried out by the three councils, there are some differences in the levels at which they are carried out. Many factors impact each council's decisions when setting service levels including asset materials and age, utilisation and technology.

Service levels related to road reserves and community services adopted the Randwick service model in the SGS financial model. To ensure no loss or degradation of services in any LGA, an additional annual expenditure of \$3.9m should be included in the financial model for childcare services and meals on wheels.

The overall impact on the SGS financial model under a 3 year transition period is an increase in costs of \$27m, resulting in an adjusted net surplus of \$418m under option 1 over ten years (before asset upliftment and debt repayment).
